# **2018 Mid-South Horn Workshop Competitions**

# **COMPETITION INFORMATION**

All competitions require advance registration, submitted with online registration no later than February 28, 2017. A \$5 fee is required for each desired entry for which the student is eligible. Previous winners of any division may not compete in the same division. Those chosen to advance will compete in the Final Round Saturday morning at 9:00 am. Solo competition finalists will be provided an accompanist and rehearsal time; they may perform with their own accompanist if desired, but must indicate so on the registration form. The winner of each division will be featured in a masterclass with Tom Varner on Saturday afternoon. ### HIGH SCHOOL SOLO COMPETITION

Students who are enrolled in grades 9 - 12 in private, public or home school, are eligible for this division. The schedule will follow that posted on the official website, with the first round beginning Friday at 4:00 pm.
